

The meeting was opened by Jerry W , District Committee Member, with a Quiet Time, followed by the reading of the Twelve Traditions. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Jerry read a letter from the General Service Office in New York explaining the expenses by GSO and the need for contributions from Groups to meet these expenses. All Groups agreed they would continue splitting the cost of the Answering Service. He requested each GSR get an up-dated list of persons willing to receive calls from the Answering Service. He will inform the Answering Service of changes in the present listing as soon as the new ones are received from the GSR's. If you have not done so, please take time before the next District Committee meeting to up-date the list of volunteers from your Group.

Jerry D Public Information Chairman, requested that each GSR give him one name of a member of each Group who would be willing to help with Public Information work. A bulletin he had received concerning Corrections and Institutions work was given to John R , Chairman of that Committee.

He reported on request to the Speaker's Bureau which had been handeled by Jerry W

Jerry also explained the possibilities for a Newsletter for District 43. Advertisements supported by individual Groups were discussed. It was suggested that it might be possible that the District support advertisements either on a continuing basis or on a short term basis. He reminded the GSR's that newsworthy releases are very valuable and are also a good tool for carrying the message to the alcoholic who still suffers.

John R reported that the Institutions Committee needs members from Lisle and Bolingbrook. Possibilities for future activities by the Institutions Committee included working with Edward Hospital, nursing homes, and local police departments. He suggested that a letter be sent to GSO requesting suggestions on how to approach police departments, nursing homes, etc. It was suggested that Groups support the placing and stocking of literature racks in various institutions. John will coordinate this service.

Volunteer work in institutions outside our District (Mercy Center, Lutheran General, Central DuPage, etc.) was discussed. There was discussion concerning the need for volunteers at the Life Enrichment Center in Winfield. The GSR's were encouraged to approach their Groups regarding the possibility of being responsible for one month of volunteer work at the Center. Any individuals who wish to support the Enrichment Center may call Bob R at 653- for further information.

Under the heading of Old Business, there was discussion regarding the date, time and location for District Committee Meetings. Alkathon volunteers were requested for Spring Conference. District 43 will cover one hour from 12:00 to 1:00 p.m. on Saturday.

LaVerne P (former Delegate to GSO from NIA) is new Grapevine Representative and requested that each Group elect a Grapevine Representative.

Bids were submitted for the 1983 Area and State Conferences. The 1983 State Conference was awared to DeKalb. The 1983 NIA Conference was awarded to Rockford.

The next NIA Committee meeting will be April 17 hosted by District 5.

The next NIA Assembly will be June 5 hosted by District 9.

Walt N. - Answering Service - gave a breakdown of calls received by the Answering Service. During 1981 there were 469 calls. Records showed an average of about 30 calls per month is increasing to about 40 calls per month. Each call is recorded on a separate slip of paper which contains specific information regarding the disbursement of the call. The callsheets are then given to Walt.



### District 40 Splits into Districts 40, 41, 42 & 43

BIG DISTRICT NOT WORKING? Here's What They Did in DuPage.

When District 40 became an organizational entity years ago, DuPage County was a thinly-populated Chicago hinterland to the west. In the last decade, especially, DuPage population has increased manifold. 1982 headcount:about 650,000. Statistically, one of every ten newcomers was alcoholic.

As the problem drinkers sought out and joined A.A., existing groups expanded; many spin-off groups and meetings were formed. By June 1981, when District 40 first officially reckoned with the matter of a too-large District, there were more than 100 meetings per week within DuPage -- within District 40. Symptoms of the impersonality of large numbers were evident. Individual groups ceased to identify with the District. Typically, only some 15 or 20 G.S.R.s attended the District's monthly meeting. Clearly, the lack of representation - and interaction - posed a problem.

At the June meeting, a motion was introduced to study the matter based on Service Manual guidelines that, ideally, a District not be made up of more than 20 groups. The reasoning was sound: smalle" districts permit more DCM visitation with individual groups as well as vitality of communications between grass-roots groups, district, area, region and G.S.O. The motion suggested a two-, three-, or four-way split of existing District 40, plus other options.

In ensuing months, a committee polled each group as a group-conscience matter to determine whether individual members favored or disfavored the split. Seventy (70) of the 100 groups were visited; about 30 favored the split, the rest had no opinion. A letter was then sent to each group stressing importance of group interaction with the various levels of A. A. Service. It asked that each group not already represented at District meetings nominate a G.S.R. so that a vote on the split might more truly represent group conscience. There were but 6 responses.

By November, 1981, regular attendees at District 40 meetings had concluded that every effort had been made to involve unrepresented groups. It was decided that members in attendance constituted a quorum capable of voting on the motion.


After polling on the split options, it was decided to split into four new Districts, each of which represented about an equal number of groups. Geographically, each new District represented a quadrant of a circle centered at the intersection of Route 53 and the East-West Tollway. District 40's proposal was taken before the December Area Assembly meeting for sanction and passed as motioned. Each new District was outfitted with its own DCM, Public Information, Hospitals & Institutions Committees plus other functions as set forth in the Service Manual.

It's working! Three times as many people now are involved in service work under more personalized and manageable conditions. Group G.S.R. representation is significantly improved. And more individual group members have become active to fill functioning committee jobs.

It took six months.

What's a faster way to split a District? As one member wryly put it: "You get so many would-be leaders hassling among themselves that finally one of them steals the coffee pot and starts his own District."
